Mayor's Charities Art Exhibition

16 to 28 October

Roll up, roll up and enjoy this vibrant, eclectic mix of works by talented and admired local and international artists, graduate students from Chichester University and clients of Stonepillow: All coming together to take part in this Art Exhibition on behalf of Chichester Mayor's charities – Stonepillow and Oxmarket Gallery.

This exciting exhibition includes work by well-known local artists Pippa Blake, Vincent Gray, Trudy Redfern, Catherine Barnes and Peter Iden, as well as Thai artist, Somboon Hormtientong. Also taking part will be alumni from Chichester University and art therapy clients from Stonepillow.

Stonepillow is a charity that provides a lifeline for homeless people with hubs, hostels and supported accommodation in Chichester, Bognor Regis and Littlehampton. Founded in 1989, the charity aims to empower homeless and vulnerable people to make positive changes in their lives. It has supported hundreds of clients to regain their independence, many of whom would otherwise still be sleeping rough on the streets. Stonepillow provides drop in art therapy sessions on Monday mornings for clients where they can express themselves freely without fear of judgement from anyone else.

Using his observation of people and animals, Mike designs and creates the 'I Love....' Award-winning series of jigsaw puzzles for the leading British games company Gibsons. Most recently, he has also been undertaking the role of Art Director and Storyboard Artist, gag writer and Script Editor for the new, animated series of The Wombles. His unique sense of humour and storytelling has brought a new lease of life to the original 1970's TV characters.

Over the years, Mike has worked in the UK, America and Holland in advertising, publishing, film and TV design, picking up many awards in the process. He has also written 'Retribution' a modern-day fairytale for older children and adults and designed the RAY JAY Nimrod 'Kit Car'.


Father and Daughter
